Tasmania excels at the Australian Country Junior Basketball Cup

A record of 13 Tasmanian teams recently attended the Australian Country Junior Basketball Cup in Albury Wodonga. With an official contingent of 160, the tournament provided an ideal development event for players, coaches, managers and referees.

Mr Chris McCoy, CEO Basketball Tasmania, said, "The Country Cup has grown on our calendar and families look forward to it each year. Our development program teams face strong competition from the larger states with Victoria Country,

NSW Country, SA Country, New Zealand and Fiji attending."

"Along with the fantastic game experiences, we find that there are also great life experiences as we work together at our large camp site to ensure everyone is well prepared throughout the week."

"Usually we win around 33 per cent of our games however, this year, we improved significantly winning around 50 per cent of our games across all 13 teams, Mr McCoy said."

In addition to the fantastic overall performance, two Under 14 Girls teams excelled with both heading to the Gold Medal game undefeated. Tasmania has never won a Gold Medal in the girls competition and has never had two teams playing off in the grand final. Overall, this is only the second Gold Medal for Tasmania with the boys winning their division two years ago.

Nearly 200 family members went along to support the Tasmanian teams with all celebrating together at a dinner held at the Commercial Club (event sponsor) in Albury.

Collingwood Magpies back in Hobart for pre-season match

The Collingwood Magpies will be sharpening their game in Hobart before the start of the 2020 Suncorp Super Netball competition.

The Magpies will face off against the Sunshine Coast Lightning in a pre-season match to be held at the Derwent Entertainment Centre on 28 February. According to head coach Rob Wright, the squad are excited to be returning to Tasmania this season.



"It's great being able to return to Tassie for another season, it's our home away from home," Wright said.

"We have a great support base in Tassie and love every opportunity we get to play in front of them."

In round four of the Suncorp Super Netball competition, Collingwood will take on the Giants on the Pies' undefeated home court at the Silverdome in Launceston.

Campbell Town Oval Redevelopment

The Northern Midlands Council has recently completed a redevelopment of the Campbell Town War Memorial Oval.

A new multi-function centre with inclusive change rooms, meeting rooms and a function centre capable of catering for 130 people has replaced the previous aged clubroom facility.



The construction of the multi-function centre

was the catalyst for combining and relocating a number of sporting and recreational facilities at the one location to provide a true sporting hub for the town. The new centre now has a direct link to the community swimming pool complex, and pool patrons will share use of the centre's amenities.

The Campbell Town Tennis Club expressed interest in relocating to the site and sold their existing facilities to contribute \$60,000 toward the development of two public tennis courts at the facility. The official opening of the courts will occur this year.

Mr Des Jennings, General Manager Northern Midlands Council said, "the total cost to develop the tennis courts and immediate surrounds was \$321,580, and we were fortunate to receive \$80,000 through the Sport and Recreation Major Grants Program. Public feedback on the new facilities has been overwhelmingly positive, and the complex is a real boost for sporting activities in the town."

Sport and Recreation Minor Grants Program

The Sport and Recreation Minor Grants
Program provides grants of between \$500
and \$10,000 to clubs, associations, local
government and other not-for-profit
providers of sport and active recreation.

The Minor Grants Program offers financial assistance towards equipment purchases and/or the development/improvement of facilities or playing surfaces that directly benefit sport and recreation clubs and improve opportunities for Tasmanians to participate in sport and active recreation.



Eligible projects must benefit sport and/or recreation clubs. Applicants must contribute at least half of the project funding. The grant round opened on 22 January 2020, and applications close at 5:00pm on 4 March 2020.

Ticket to Play launches for 2020

The Ticket to Play sports voucher program is open for 2020.

Ticket to Play provides vouchers up to \$100 towards club membership for children aged 5-17 years who are listed on a Centrelink Health Care or Pensioner Concession Card or in Out of Home Care. The voucher can be used toward the cost of club membership fees.



The aim of the program is to increase the number of young Tasmanians joining clubs and being active in their communities.

The program launched for the first time in 2019 and provided over 6,000 Tasmanian children with vouchers towards club membership. AFL and Auskick combined had over 1,300 children

participate using a Ticket to Play voucher. Scouts, Guides and Cadets had a combined figure of over 300 participants using vouchers.

With over 30 sports participating and more than 800 clubs, there is a sport for everyone. Get your Ticket to Play and join a club now!

Upcoming sporting events

Tasmania has a full calendar of sporting events during the coming weeks with a range of state and national events taking place.

A busy schedule for tennis has begun with the Hobart and Burnie International tournaments already completed. The Launceston International tournament takes place at the Launceston Regional Tennis Centre, from 3 - 9 March 2020.

Touch Football Tasmania will host the 2020 State Cup on the weekend of 8 and 9 February. The State Cup will take place in Launceston and will incorporate both junior and senior competitions.



In swimming news, Swimming Tasmania will host the 2020 Sprint and Relay Championships at the Launceston Aquatic Centre on Saturday 15 and Sunday 16 February 2020.

Badminton Tasmania will host the Australian National Championships and the Ede Clendlinnen Shield in late February in Launceston.

In motorsport, the North West Car Club will host the 2020 Motorsport Australia Tasmania Hillclimb series at Highclere, on Saturday 22 February. The Hobart Sporting Car Club will host Round One the 2020 Motorsport Australia Tasmania Circuit Racing and Hillclimb Championships at the Baskerville Raceway, Old Beach on Sunday 1 March 2020.

Meanwhile, Equestrian Tasmania is hosting the State Dressage Championships on Saturday 29 February and Sunday 1 March 2020 at the Bunjarra Equestrian Centre in Thirlstane. The event will cater for Classes from Preliminary to Grand Prix, including freestyles from Novice to Grand Prix.

March is also busy for Triathlon with the Paratriathlon Word Series, Elite and Under 23 Continental Cup Series and National Junior Championships all being held in Devonport.

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
